Round table "Portugal – China / Macau Relations: Culture and Bridge of Dialogue"

On January 8, 2020, the China Observatory, in partnership with UCCLA (Union of Capital Cities of Portuguese-Speaking Countries) collaborated in the organization of the round table - "Portugal—China/Macau Relations - Culture Bridge of Dialogues", which took place at UCCLA facilities.



Exhibition: The Invisible Thread, "Contemporary art Portugal-Macau-China"

In January 2020, the China Observatory organized, in partnership with UCCLA, the exhibition "The invisible thread, contemporary art Portugal-Macau/China", under the General Coordination of Rui Lourido. Macau is the city that currently presides over the UCCLA. The exhibition marked 20 years since the creation of the Macau Special Administrative Region and 40 years since the re-establishment of diplomatic relations between Portugal and the PRC.




Chinese language courses

On October 20, 2020, the China Observatory promoted and participated in different activities focused on the study of Chinese culture, in collaboration with associations in the field and national and international academic entities, namely the Chinese Academy of Social Sciences (CASS).





Institutional cooperation

The China Observatory signed different institutional cooperation protocols, namely with the Portugal-China Chamber of Cooperation and Development, with the League of Chinese in Portugal and with the Chamber of Commerce for Small and Medium Enterprises.



The China Observatory has intensified its relationship with UCCLA, a partnership resulting from the existing Protocol between UCCLA Supporting Members, both institutions have proven to be very mutually beneficial.



The China Observatory supported the creation of the Union of Cooperation Associations with China, a platform that aims to intensify and deepen relations between Portugal and China.
